In April of 2006, The Stephen A. Comunale, Jr. Family Cancer Foundation was founded in Akron, Ohio by the Comunale family and friends to honor the memory of Stephen A. Comunale, Jr. who fought a courageous battle against cancer. A year later, his aunt Amy Comunale Klein was diagnosed with cancer. In August 2011, Stephen's loving mother passed away after a brave fight with cancer. The Foundation lives in memory of Stephen, Amy and Jane.

OUR MISSION

The Stephen A. Comunale Jr. Family Cancer Foundation is a nonprofit 501c3 organization that endows an outreach program to provide comfort to cancer patients and their families by easing the ancillary financial burdens that confront them.

By partnering with social workers, community members, hospitals and other organizations, our efforts empower cancer patients while improving their quality of life.

10,000 Sunshine bags distributed to oncology centers in local hospitals since 2006.




\$3.3 Million granted in financial assistance since 2006.

TASTE OF HEALTH

The latest research indicates that following a plant-based diet helps your body's health and strengthens your immune system. A plant-based diet means that the majority of

what you eat comes from plant foods: fruits, vegetables, grains, beans, nuts and seeds and has also been shown to reduce your risk for many types of cancer.

In partnership with the Stephen A. Comunale Jr. Family Cancer Foundation, participants of the Summa Health Taste of Health event were given grocery kits with all of the ingredients needed to make a pre-selected, plant-based meal. Additionally, as available, fresh, locally-grown produce was purchased to construct the grocery kits. Included in the kits were also a plant-based diet cook book and literature regarding lowering your risk of cancer and cancer recurrence.



"THE EVENT" 2021 WAS OUT OF THIS WORLD

Thank you to so many friends, families and supporters of the Foundation for making our 2021 event a wonderful success.

On September 25, 2021, more than 700 guests attended "The Event" raising over \$1.5 million for the Foundation. The entertainment was "Starship." Steve Comunale, founder of the Foundation, said "As we grow each year and raise more money, there were more and more people to help. Our goal each year is to increase our grant donations." Looking to 2022, the Foundation will grant and distribute \$375,000. Since its initial year, the Foundation

MEET ED SUTTER - FOUR LEAF CLOVER RUN



Ed Sutter lost two sisters to cancer. Seeing the devastation cancer causes led Ed to want to help others suffering from the disease.

With a personal love of running (he qualified for the Boston Marathon 4 times) he started

the Four Leaf Clover Run in 2016. Since then, Ed has raised over \$100,000. His annual event raises money for the Comunale Foundation, as well as Project Ed Bear and he often adopts a "Fighter" - a cancer patient battling the disease.

Sutter, who owns Eddie's Cheesesteak on Main, is proud of building this event, which he calls a "Magical day on the brick roads of Akron." It's magical because the race draws upwards of 500 runners and is very competitive, but it also welcomes walkers and casual runners so everyone is encouraged to participate to help those in need. "We designed the course to start at Saint V Church and school where we attended school and travels along the brick roads of Akron where we grew up." The course then finishes back at St. V, where guests can enjoy a great meal and entertainment (this year's band will be The Spasmatics).

This year the activities are set for the Cadiliac Hill Challenge on June 10 and the main race on June 11. You can get more information at fourleafcloverrun.org. This year's race will benefit the Comunale Foundation, Project Ed Bear and Stewart's Caring Place Summer Camp.

"I wanted to help people in our area. Nothing national, so I researched organizations that help kids and adults right here in Akron," said Sutter.

"I lost one sister Michelle to cancer in 2015. It really spurred me to do something. Then a dear friend Michael Sullivan passed away from cancer, which hit me very hard. Little would I know, one month after Michael my other sister, Mary would pass away from cancer too. Those are the initials on our social media #MTS MVS MAS - for those three wonderful people."

With this experience, Sutter saw how many people right in our community are struggling everyday with cancer - and we thank him for his passionate work. The Foundation appreciates the many partners for making the Four Leaf Clover Run such an amazing event. Some of the partners include Budweiser & The House of LaRose, the in-kind work of the City of Akron and Physicians Ambulance, which sponsors the Taylor Ceepo Memorial Finish Line.
